## LEARNING TO MAKE THE WORLD A BETTER PLACE

The Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232h, requires Prairie Creek Community School to notify parents/guardians and allow them to opt their child out of participating in certain school activities. These activities include a student survey, analysis, or evaluation that concerns one or more of the following eight areas ("protected information surveys"):

- 1. Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student's parent;
- 2. Mental or psychological problems of the student or student's family;
- 3. Sex behavior or attitudes;
- 4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
- 5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- 6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
- 7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents; or
- 8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

This requirement also applies to the collection, disclosure or use of student information for marketing purposes ("marketing surveys"), and certain physical exams and screenings.

The following is a schedule of activities requiring parental notice and opt-out for the upcoming school year. This list is not exhaustive and for surveys and activities scheduled after the school year starts, Prairie Creek Community School will provide parents, within a reasonable period of time prior to the administration of the surveys and activities, notification of the surveys and activities and be provided an opportunity to opt their child out, as well as an opportunity to review the surveys.

## Date: 2023-2024

Grades: Fifth grade Minnesota Student Survey (MSS).

Summary: The MSS is conducted in schools across our state every three years. This survey is optional and parents will be provided with prior notice of administration.

Opt-Out: Contact your student's school Directors if you do not want your child to participate in the Minnesota Student Survey.

Activities Requiring Consent (for U.S. Department of Education funded, protected information surveys only): A parent must sign and return a consent form to your child's school so your child may participate in this activity. Activities Requiring Opt-out (for any non-U.S. Department of Education funded protection information survey, including surveys administered by the Minnesota Department of Education): Parents must contact their child's school if you do not want your child to participate in this activity.

If you wish to review any survey instrument or instructional material used in connection with any protected information or marketing survey, please submit a request to your child's school. You will be notified of the time and place where you may review these materials. You have the right to review a survey and/or instructional materials before the survey is administered to a student.
