Special Services Programs

Prairie Creek Community School provides support to students through a range of special service programs. Students who qualify for special education may be provided services in a variety of spaces including the regular classroom, through individualized instruction or in a resource room. A team of regular education and special education personnel works with parents to determine the type of education best fitted to meet the learner's individual needs.

For those students who qualify, an individualized educational plan (IEP) is developed cooperatively between parents and school staff. Special education services are available to students who qualify in the areas of:

- Autism Spectrum Disorder Deaf – Blind
- Deaf Hard of Hearing Development Cognitive
- Disability Developmental Delay – Ages 3-6
- Emotional / Behavioral Disorder
- Other Health Disabilities Physical Disability
- Severe Multiple Disability Specific Learning
- Disability Speech / Language Impairment
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Visual Impairment
